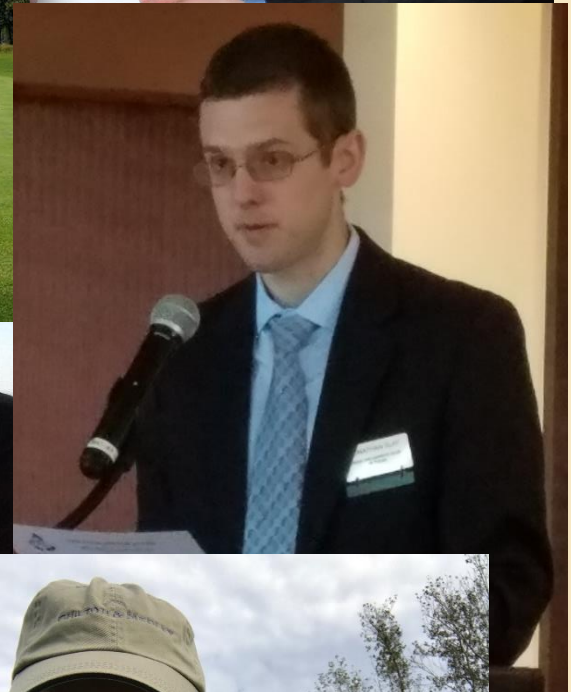


PRESIDENT'S LETTER

NOVEMBER IAL RECAP

Nov. 8, 2017 the Desk & Derrick Club of Tulsa hosted their annual Industry Appreciation Luncheon at the Summit Club in downtown Tulsa. Guests came from near and far, as many guests as members attended. The members decorated the tables nicely, provided a program and a "Mint" at each place setting. The "Mint" was more than just a piece of candy, it came with a message. "Like pieces of a puzzle, we are all essential" – Thank You for your involve – "mint"; and your commit – "mint" to our association. Here's a little something for your enjoy – "mint".

Each year, the members enjoy recognizing the supporters of the industry at IAL. Our special speaker this year was Dr. Kyle Murray from the Oklahoma Geological Survey presenting Seismicity in Oklahoma: A Scientifically Informed Status Update. Dr. Murray is a hydrogeologist that investigates physical and chemical properties of geologic materials that store and produce fluids and conducts regional studies. He has partnered with other geoscientists to understand the geologic factors,, resource management and the recent seismicity in Oklahoma.

In his presentation, he discussed the trends of the earthquakes in Oklahoma, his maps showed areas of activity and correlations that the geoscientists have studied. He discussed the water injection reservoirs and how they have placed monitoring stations to measure these types of correlations. The data collected and the studies will be key to education of the seismicity.

He showed an amazing video clip of the natural pressure released in one of the zones that water is injected into.

The audience had many questions for Dr. Murray, some asking about other possible causes he didn't mention and are those going to be studied. He indicated that his group is open to studying the various theories.

Upon conclusion of the presentation, Alesia Bailey gave away door prizes donated by IHS Markit.

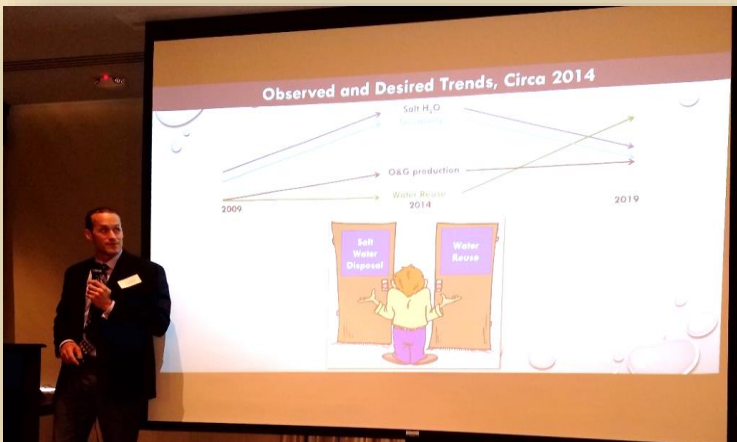
Jonathan Slay, wrapped up the luncheon and dismissed the group in a timely manner.

Potentially induced earthquakes in Oklahoma, USA: Links between wastewater injection and the 2011 M_w 5.7 earthquake sequence **2013**

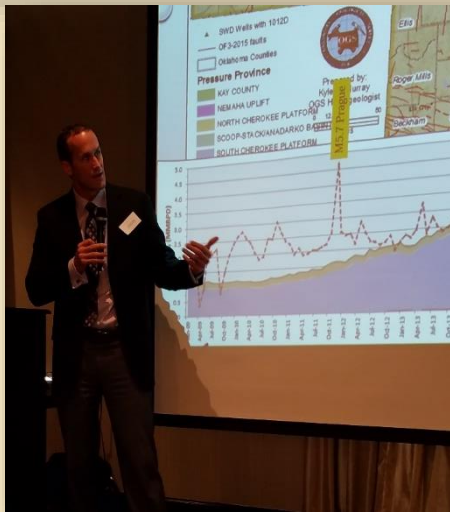

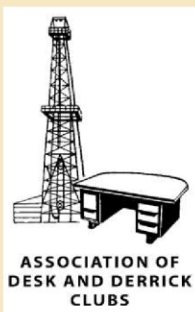

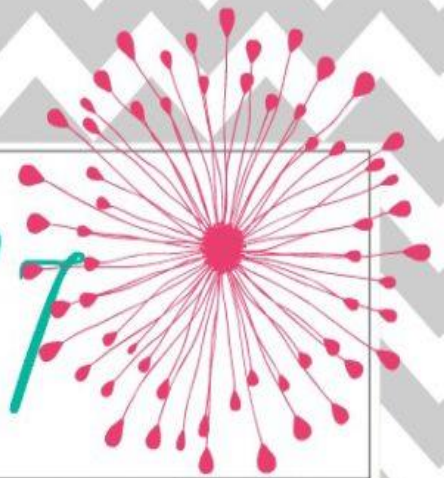
