PRESIDENT'S LETTER



Desk and Derrick Club of Tulsa

Dear Members,

I am very excited to share the benefits of the hard work and planning that has been going on in January as we prepare for an outstanding Region VI Meeting in late April. Our members have pulled together to plan restful lodging, fascinating speakers, and many other details to make this a conference you will remember and enjoy. After touring the beautiful Postoak Lodge, I highly encourage all of you to consider staying overnight.

As part of my emphasis on gaining knowledge, here is a current market update with tidbits from consulting firm Tudor Pickering Holt:

Investors and those in the workforce are pleased to see the DJIA surpass 20,000 points for the first time in history. New home builds are peaking at pre-2009 recessionary levels as consumer confidence leads to timely investing of large dollars in real estate just as borrowing rates are starting to rise above 4% on 30-year rates. In his first week in office, President Trump required the State Department to respond to TRP's Keystone XL pipeline application by the end of March without having to conduct a new environmental study, which could bring heavy crude production and new jobs to Gulf Coast refineries. While OPEC members are close to meeting the output cuts announced in November, oil prices continue to edge sideways with little predictability. Overall, we are seeing some firming in the markets and assurance to Tulsa employees.

Baker Hughes says rig counts added 51 over the past four weeks and a backlog of drilled but uncompleted wells ("DUCs") is building. This highlights drillers' confidence in future prices, though adding U.S. supply earlier than demand can soak it up may dampen market pricing and profits in the near term. As the weather warms, we should see well completions accelerate and catch up with the rig additions, stabilizing pricing this summer.

As a kickoff to this year's luncheon learning, our club members will enjoy a two-part mini-series on drilling. Please join us on February 8 and March 8 for a fun and informative discussion led by geologist and noted speaker Kristie Luchtel Ferguson.

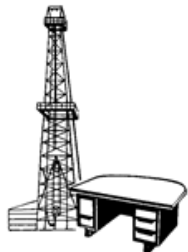
