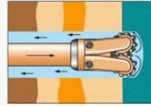

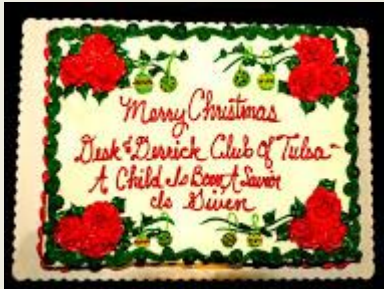

Theme

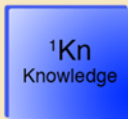

MEMBERSHIP IDEAS: (Author, Imogene Mecaskey, State Director of Pan Am Round Tables)

New members must be made to feel wanted and needed as soon as possible. A welcoming letter from the Club President/Director is an effective way of making a new member feel welcomed.

It is extremely important to get new members active in committee activities immediately. Involvement creates interest.

Regular members who failed to renew their membership should be contacted, followed by personal phone calls if necessary. Let them know they have been missed. Regular members who have missed a meeting should also be called and told: "We missed you..." This should encourage them to return.

Members who have been active in the past might be persuaded to become active again with a personal telephone call or by being asked to do a specific job.

Perhaps if contacted, former members might like to rejoin.

Happy New Year 2015 Presidents:

Hopefully you are as excited about turning the page to a new year as I am. Congratulations on serving your club as their President this year!

Being a part of the Program Committee is very interesting and satisfying. It has been a few years since I served as a Regional Program Rep and I truly enjoyed reading about all the meetings in my region. Although it may be a challenge for the clubs to find educational and interesting speakers for **nine** programs, keep in mind that Clubs may sponsor one Desk and Derrick Orientation and two socio-economic or professional self-development programs during the year.

Why is it necessary to monitor and stay compliant? The Association of Desk and Derrick Clubs has received an exemption from paying U.S. Federal Income Tax because our primary purpose is education. To retain our tax-exempt status, each Club is required to file a monthly Program Report to verify that we are in compliance with the tax law and our ADDC Bylaws requiring nine educational meetings per year. The Program Reports will be kept as a permanent record in case we are audited by the IRS.

Program Report Form PRGM 1, and instructions for completing the form, can be found on the ADDC website at www.ADDC.org under ADDC Forms. A yearly spreadsheet of the form is attached. Please look over the form become familiar with it. If you have any questions, please ask.

Please complete the form and submit within seven days after your meeting. The form is to be mailed, e-mailed, or faxed to your Region Program Committee Representative. The Region Representative will accumulate the entire month prior to forwarding to ADO and myself. If your club is not sponsoring a program in a particular month, a form should still be completed indicating "NO MEETING." If you need any help completing the form or have any questions, your Region Rep or I will be glad to assist you.

Also, please complete the "Program Club Meeting Schedule" (attached with the PRGM 1 form) and submit to your Region Program Rep. This form will assist us in tracking the monthly Program reports.

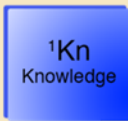
It is very important to state the Article number or Standing Rule number as it now reads, and then state the wording you are proposing.
