He then served in the first Gulf War and later in Operation Southern Watch, where Chuck provided weather support for the no fly zone over southern Iraq and northern Kuwait.

After ten years in the military, Chuck joined the private sector in a variety of roles, including television and radio. He is an accomplished communicator and has a passion for helping owners/operators understand the regulatory processes now that he serves the O&G industry.

## “THE FACE OF POVERTY & HOMELESSNESS”

Ms. Karen Streeter, Executive Director of the Transitional Living Centers of Oklahoma-Lindsey House has dedicated 27 years of her life working with homeless families to help them achieve their dreams of self-sufficiency. In December 2010, she came to Tulsa to work with Lindsey House, which currently provides a place to call home for 12 homeless mothers and their children for up to 18 months.

According to statistics, there are more than 28 million children, who are close to being homeless, due to an unexpected medical bill or car repair that prevents their parents from paying their rent or mortgage. Most people think of the homeless population as being long-haired, dirty men lying under a bridge or on a sidewalk. However, (as Karen explained) it can be hardworking people like us that have lost their job due to unforeseen circumstances, or a family who has someone with a gambling or alcohol addiction. And, women and children are the largest and fastest growing segment of homelessness.

Karen's work with the Lindsey House provides a place for mothers to learn how to manage a budget, make good life choices, survive on their own, and even overcome addictions (if they are struggling with that). Most of the families that come to Lindsey House have never applied for government assistance, as it is very difficult for most people to ask for help. But, there is nothing worse than not being able to provide for your children, and this program partners with the community to do just that.

Lindsey House is supported by donations and volunteers who help get each apartment ready for a family and furnish it with the basic household items, such as dishes, cookware, linens, food, and much more. We appreciated all of the information that Karen Streeter brought to our club, which enlightened us on the face of poverty and homelessness. Thank you, Karen, for your dedication to help these families have a second chance at life!

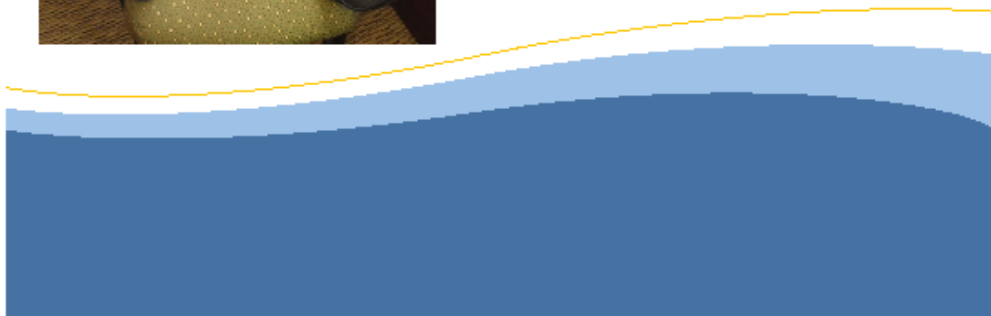

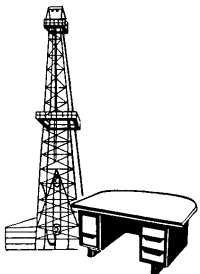
**Dear Members,**

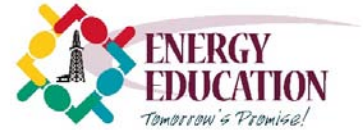
