September Meeting Recap

The September speaker on Sept. 13 educated us all on Oil and Gas leasing. Tonya Fraley, CPL, CPLTA holds many hats in the Land and Leasing world. She is a member of TALTA, NALTA, SADOA, NADOA, TAPL and AAPL. She first educated the non-land professionals on a few of those strange sounding organizations, like TALTA, Tulsa Association of Lease and Title Analysts or NALTA, National Association of Lease and Title Analysts where she serves on the board.

She also shared that her 6 year old son wanted to offer his input on her speech, he thought a good thing to talk about would be "Pokemon Go"! It seems he is a very skilled Pokemon Go person and has achieved several levels.

A trainer once shared in a class that she was taking that the most valuable asset in the Oil and Gas company is the lease. That would make the land department employee the guardian of the most valuable asset. I have a background in Geology as a Geotech, and the geologist finds the oil and gas reservoirs, however, I don't think I can argue with that statement because there would be no drilling without the leasing.

Tonya explained how important understanding the leasing records are to the land department as well as the land and mineral owner. The Lease Analyst pays the lease obligations, inputs accurate lease records for the company and maintains those records. The Division Order Analyst sets up the payments of the owners correctly according to the terms of the lease and will answer owner questions as they come in. The Land department, landmen, etc. negotiate the terms of the lease in the interest of the company and the landowner. He must know the plans of the company so the lease will allow for future plans. The mineral owner is responsible to understand his/her documents and rights.

Tonya outlined the 5 most misunderstood lease clauses.

- 1. Habendum clause the primary and secondary terms
- 2. Legal description this is the address to the minerals, it is read right to left not left to right.
- 3. Acreage description the net acreage is not included in the lease so often the gross acreage in the description misleads a person to think they have more acreage than the net.
- 4. Royalty clause How is the payment portion calculated? This is something the owner need to understand, the lease can express interest as a fraction, decimal or percentage. Tanya actually asked the audience to interact with math problems to see how this calculation works.
- 5. Favored Nations clause This has to do with what your surrounding neighbors got as a lease bonus if you are the owner. There are all kinds of factors such as location, parties, time-frame, etc. the lease bonus is not public knowledge so this may or may not come into play. Note: It is the lessee's responsibility to track this and ethically be fair to the land owners and if circumstances change a good lessee would make the parties whole again if they had been underpaid.

Well, the group tested very smart at leasing when the speaker gave them a quiz, of course! Next we got a good laugh from a video clip of Ma & Pa Kettle trying to figure a calculation! So 14 and 5 equals 25, doesn't it!!! -----Jill Klein





Dr. Kyle E. Murray earned a PhD in Geological Engineering from Colorado School of Mines in 2003, and has worked as a consultant or academic researcher for more than 20 years. He is currently employed as a Hydrogeologist for the Oklahoma Geological Survey (OGS), which is part of the University of Oklahoma (OU) Mewbourne College of Earth and Energy. His research team investigates physical and chemical properties of geologic materials that store and produce fluids, and conducts regional-scale studies of water, earth, and environmental resources. Water management in the energy industry is his current primary research area. Because of recent seismic activity in Oklahoma, Dr. Murray is partnering with other geoscientists to understand relationships between geologic factors, resource management, and seismicity.

To save expenses the Board has voted to combine the positions into one the ADDC Business Manager. As of January 1, 2018, Wayne Ammons will be assuming that role. This is not a reflection on the performance of our current ADO Manager, Mark Loch. It is strictly a cost saving measure. Mark has been an outstanding employee, and it has been my pleasure to work with him over the last year. I know he will continue to serve our members with the same professionalism and enthusiasm through the remainder of his tenure. Mark was a former Association Secretary, and I know he plans on running for the Board again. He has mu utmost gratitude and respect.

Summary of 2017 Bylaw Changes

V: Add a clarifying comment stating VP role is a training period for President role.

VII: IPP becomes first in line to assume President duties in case of a vacancy, then if unwilling, VP shall succeed. This gives members two possible leaders to fill a vacancy, rather than one. Having IPP as first in line for a president vacancy is consistent with ADDC's bylaws, and assures members that an experienced leader is ready to help the club continue to operate in the event of a president vacancy. No change to VP serving duties of President in case of President's temporary absence.

VIII: Starting in January 2018, members meet on 3rd Wed, rather than 2nd, to boost attendance for members with deadlines in week two.

IX: Board quorum becomes easier to achieve. Rather than having to count all 9 seats and needing 5, a quorum will depend on number of seats filled.

XII: Section 2a, 2b and 3 are updated to be consistent with separating out region dues and stating bylaws *or resolutions*. Increase of \$10 ADDC, and only \$2 for club.

XIV: Section 4(j) now has the club's correct website address. Added the extra "d."

XVIII: 2a removes references to Region "VI."

In order to modernize T bylaws to accommodate the upcoming realignment or any future renaming of regions, we're removing Roman Numeral references to our region. Tulsa bylaws had "VI" in three places in this Article. If the realignment does or does not pass, we will have generic wording that will accommodate either outcome. Not referring to the region number is consistent with the OKC Club's bylaws, per my inquiry of the RD.

XXI: Seven-day notice for bylaw changes, to be consistent with notice period for Slate.

Closing: On the last page, we are deleting the last sentence regarding updates in odd and even years, since we don't know how the Region delegates will modify the region resolutions in April 2018 to adapt if the realignment passes in Nov 2017. The last sentence on the last page is now deleted:

"Even numbered Regions in even years and Odd numbered Regions in odd years."
