The Tulsa Oil Drop



Marina Metevelis a.k.a. Rosie the Riveter Director at Heritage Center at TCC Speaking on "The Great History and Stories of Tulsa during the Big Oil Days".

Marina Metevelis was born in Wichita, Kansas in 1924. An American workforce pioneer, she held several jobs previously reserved for men. She was 16 when Pearl Harbor was bombed in 1941; she applied for a job at the Wichita aircraft plant where the B-17 Flying Fortresses met the wings that carried them into battle. She became a Rosie the Riveter her senior year in high school. When she was a kid, Marina spent summers in Tulsa visiting her uncles. They were 32nd Degree Masons, and so were the oil barons. During those visits, she met all of the oil barons; thus her knowledge of Tulsa's history and the tunnels in downtown Tulsa.

Marina married Don Metevelis a young man from Tulsa, and followed her man from one Army camp to another. She raised a family with Don, who survived Omaha Beach on D-Day. Marina's husband passed away in 2003 and she spends her days working at TCC and sometimes reminisces about life on the assembly line when she fulfills various local speaking engagements.

Please come and hear Marina's amazing story and the history of our own Downtown Tulsa and how it was once known as the Oil Capital of the World.

A two hour field trip will be held on Friday Sept. 13, with Marina leading the walk of downtown Tulsa and the tunnels. Tour will meet at 12:30 p.m. at the Philtower Building, 5th and Boston.

Tulsa Geoscience Center Field Trip

The Desk & Derrick August field trip to the Tulsa Geoscience Center was a huge success and was enjoyed by everyone.

As usual, our group started off with lunch. This time we met up at Billy's on the square in downtown Tulsa. The food was excellent and made for a great start on a fun and informative day. After lunch at Billy's, we walked a little more than a block on S. Main St. to the Tulsa Geoscience Center where we were greeted by director, Susan Henley and volunteer Dr. Norman Hyne.

Susan and Norman enthusiastically guided us through each room in the center-the earthquake room, fossil room, rock & mineral room, fossil dig room, fluorescent room and petroleum room.

What makes this center different from a museum is that nothing is behind glass and everything is hands-on. We got to hold real fossils, a meteorite, and radioactive rocks, to name just a few. We were taught how a Tsunami is formed by placing a tuning fork in water and even made our own rubber bands using latex and a few chemicals.

Tulsa is fortunate to have the only science museum in the area, even Oklahoma City has expressed an interest in ours. Students have traveled as far as 150 miles to visit the center. The educational value is priceless and they serve all interested schools including the under-served, home-schooled, boy scouts and girl scouts. We could just imagine how a visit to the center could spark a child's interest and plant the seed for a whole career path and it's FREE!

After our trip to the geoscience center was over, most of us went home with a greater knowledge of rocks, minerals, and fossils. We discovered how Geology encompasses a vast number of subject areas such as Geophysics, Volcanology, Sedimentology, and Mineralogy to name just a few, and they are all just below our feet!
