101 Years Ago..... by Michael Evans


101 years ago a small operator decided to drill a well in hopes of becoming rich. He probably used all his money and borrowed the rest against whatever assets he had. His dreams were big. He decided to start the year out the right way by spudding his location on New Years Day. He had a cable tool rig and a couple of hardy hands to help him realize his dreams. Mules pulled a few wagons out to this location from Oklahoma City over 60 miles across fields and small trails. They probably departed in early December in 1917.

It only took about a week to shovel off the location and hand dig a mud pit. The rig went up in just 5 days. They had to chop down a few trees and cut them up for fuel. FINALLY, the process began: the 3 man crew picked the bit up and dropped it hundreds of times every day thru brutal cold of January, February and March. But the tents were warm and kept them dry during the rain and snow. The pounding continued on hour after hour with dedication through the terrible storms that spring offers in Oklahoma.

Then came summer. June, July and August. HOT. REALLY HOT. No A/C. No fans. Limited access to water and food. There are no restaraunts, no gas stations, and very few roads greater than a wagon trail, So most of their food they hunted or fished and occasionally a wagon would come with supplies. Then, in September, they probably ran out of money. The dream was shattered. The well was dry. They had made 3005 feet in 8 months. Tempers flared since it was very common to accept pay for success. When the well would gush in people would get paid. The crew may not have earned much since they too gambled on a big pay day at the end.

I could find no other well drilled by P Oil and Gas. It was a one shot effort to become wealthy and he risked it all. But whoever P was, he knew it was hard work and high risk and he did not hesitate. He was truly an oil man and he paid the price for that title. And this was just one cable tool well out of thousands drilled in Oklahoma before 1920.


