Tulsa Board Open Positions

PRESIDENT: The President shall be the Chairman of the Board of Directors; shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors and of the Club; shall appoint all committee chairmen, except as otherwise provided herein, subject to ratification by a majority of the Board of Directors and shall call special meetings of the Board of Directors. The President shall sign all checks jointly with the Treasurer or the Vice President and shall perform such additional duties as may be required of the office. The President shall serve as an exofficio member of all committees except the Nominating and Tally Committees. The President shall represent the Club in all its affairs and serve as Contact Representative between the Club and Association. **Required to have 1-year Board experience.**

VICE PRESIDENT: The Vice President shall assume the duties of the President in case of an absence; shall carry on the correspondence of the Club; shall provide employment information to membership and shall perform such other duties as the President may designate. Position shall serve as a training period to prepare the individual to run for the position of President the following year. **Required to have 1-year Board experience.**

SECRETARY: The Secretary shall keep a factual and unbiased record of the proceedings of all meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors and shall perform such additional duties as may be required of the office. Custody of the Charter and Bylaws and all club records not specifically assigned to another office shall be the responsibility of the Secretary. **Great starting position for new member to learn as taking notes.**


TREASURER: Ideal candidate should be organized; financial background a plus. The Treasurer shall collect and disburse all funds of the Club as directed by the Board of Directors; sign all checks jointly with the President or the Vice President; furnish the Board of Directors with statements of income and expenditures as requested; submit books for a review for accuracy as directed by the Board of Directors, such review to be performed by a qualified reviewer selected by the Board of Directors; be responsible for preparation of the Annual Budget, assisted by the Immediate Past Treasurer; perform such additional duties as may be required of the office.

DIRECTORS for 2021-2022: Two (2) Directors shall attend the monthly board meetings to discuss matters of the club, provide feedback, and be present to vote on certain items. Each member of the board will also serve as Board Contacts to the various committees, as appointed by the President.


This Week in Petroleum History, September 28 to October 4

Date	Event	
9/28/1945	President Truman claims America's Outer Continental Shelf, "to encourage discovery and development of oil."	
9/30/2006	Bronze Roughnecks dedicated at Signal Hill, California near Los Alamitos No. 1 which in 1921 revealed California's prolific Long Beach oilfield 20 miles south of Los Angeles.	
10/1/1908	Ford Motor Company produces First Model T in Detroit. Between 1908 and 1927, Ford would build about 15 million Model Ts, each fueled by inexpensive gasoline	
10/1/1942	Water Injection Project begins in East Texas. East Texas Salt Water Disposal Company drilled the first salt water injection well in the 12-year-old East Texas oilfield near the towns of Tyler, Longview, and Kilgore.	
10/2/1919	William Grove Skelly incorporates Skelly Oil in Tulsa, Oklahoma. As Tulsa promoted itself as "Oil Capital of the World", Skelly became known as "Mr. Tulsa," thanks to his support for many civic causes	
10/3/1930	East Texas Oilfield discovered on Widow Bradford's Farm as part of the Woodbine formation, which would produce 5+ billion barrels of oil in coming decades.	
10/4/1866	Oil Fever spreads to Allegheny River Valley. Just 15 miles from Titusville, PA the discovery at Triumph Hill sparked a wild, uncontrolled rush of new drilling.	



Spectators gathered on the widow Daisy Bradford's farm near Kilgore, Texas, to watch the October 3, 1930, "shooting" of the discovery well of what proved to be the largest oilfield in the lower-48 states.
