You may have noticed a bit of commotion at the head table tonight. We've been wondering whether to share this news with you now or later, but the "powers that be" have advised us that this could well be the **last** Region VI Meeting of the Association of Desk and Derrick Clubs. *(Lights in the room go out thanks to a pre-arranged plan with the host club.)* Thanks to my Girl Scout/General Arrangements Co-Chair, Cassie Cawyer, I have a flashlight up here to see us through the room's power outage. 1. Raising funds for the Energy Activity Books and donation of such to local schools. Going into the schools and seeing the kids get excited is a great feeling.
2. Membership is asking for more field trips. It's a great way to get to know one another and become more involved with the organization.

In my "storm readiness preparation", I also asked club presidents to share with me one grand scheme that we might be able to do as a region. Not every club president responded but the ones that did offered these great suggestions:

- 1. I would love to see clubs work together on recruiting and out-reach events. Clubs can get so tired and run out of ideas.
- 2. Better communication between the various region clubs would be great. It might get more people to attend the regional meetings.
- 3. I have always been impressed with the professional quality that Desk and Derrick clubs operate under and the opportunity for growth both individually and professionally, but I'm not sure the industry sees us that way. Wouldn't it be wonderful if we were that resource of knowledge for individuals and companies in our area of influence?

(As each club was discussed, lights in banquet hall were turned on section by section until all were on.)

The room is looking much brighter again. Perhaps the key is networking or leadership—both attributes were exemplified in this exercise. What if every club shared their bulletin with the other eight clubs? Might we not realize that "better communication", which was suggested by one president? That one act would also give other clubs fresh ideas that might be incorporated in their home clubs, answering the "tired club syndrome". Is it wise to quit your local chapter just because your employer no longer financially supports you? It seems to me, that's when you need our resources the most. In fact, one grand scheme might be to host an industry-related job fair for those members who have recently lost their jobs. If you are being forced to re-invent yourself, taking advantage of all educational opportunities will light our path of out of the darkness. (*Room goes dim again briefly as the speaker shines her flashlight.*)

I'd encourage you to remember how it feels to be sitting in the dark. How would you feel if Region VI disbanded? What if the Association folded--would it affect you? Would that two hours/mo you'd gain from giving up a dinner meeting really make a difference to your family time? Couldn't your club change its agenda to shorten the time needed for a program? Would it hurt you as a club leader to be more inclusive of your male counterparts? Together, we can illuminate the world! (Lights are turned back on.)






Please volunteer a little time for this fun and worthwhile event.


